The First Amendment

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech; or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for a redress of grievances.

Democracy

The net has become a democratizing force with many new voices. It facilitates redistribution of information. Information is no longer owned by the "fourth estate" (traditional media). The internet allows people to explore their curiosity and connect with others, but also allows for scammers, spam, hate speech, etc. The ability to speak and be read is amplified by the internet.

Freedom of Speech

Is freedom of speech borderless? We have limitations in press because there is enforceable accountability. Online, captchas and age restriction warnings enforce slight but bypassable limitations.

Reno v. ACLU

Reno v. ACLU was a United States Supreme Court case in which all 9 Justices of the Court voted to strike down anti-obscenity provision of the Communications Decency Act (DCA), finding that they violated the freedom of speech provisions of the First Amendment.
