## **John Stuart Mill**

- Where does the authority of society begin?
- “Everyone who receives the protection of society owes a return for the benefit, and the fact of living in society renders it indispensable that each should be bound to observe a certain line of conduct towards the rest.”
- “The acts of an individual may be hurtful to others or wanting in due consideration for their welfare, without going to the length of violating any of their constitutional rights. The offender may then be justly punished by opinion, though not by law.”

- “As soon as any part of a person’s conduct affects prejudicially the interests of others, society has jurisdiction over it, and the question whether the general welfare will or will not be promoted by interfering with it becomes open to discussion.”
- “In all cases, there should be perfect freedom, legal and social, to do the action and stand the consequences.”
- John Stuart Mill’s conception of liberty involved freedom of people instead of state control.
- Utilitarianism - Greatest Happiness Principle

### **Where is society heading?**

- “A civilization that can thus succumb to its vanquished enemy must first have become so degenerate that neither its appointed priests and teachers, not anybody else, has the capacity, or will take the trouble, to stand up for it.”
- Is THIS civilization?
- Where are we going in 2020?
- The transparency of people and organizations will increase, but that will not necessarily yield more personal integrity, social tolerance, or forgiveness.
- What has the Internet given us? What has it taken from us?
- Who is ethically responsible for the release of information without fact-checking?
- Does the internet facilitate revolution?
